THE BUZZ: MORE NUTRITIOUS SCHOOL LUNCHES – The new USDA dietary guidelines for 2010 include lower sodium and calorie intake along with an increase of fresh fruits, vegetables and whole grains. The updated school meal requirements follow these guidelines and will take effect in 2012. The goal of these new requirements is to help educate students on changing their eating habits for an overall healthier lifestyle. Fortunately, we do not have to make many changes to our school lunch program since we already offer fresh fruits and vegetables on a daily basis and often incorporate whole grains into our meals. Although we do not practice adding sodium to our meals, the challenge will be for manufacturers to reduce sodium in their products. Many manufacturers have already taken steps to lower sodium levels to meet school standards.

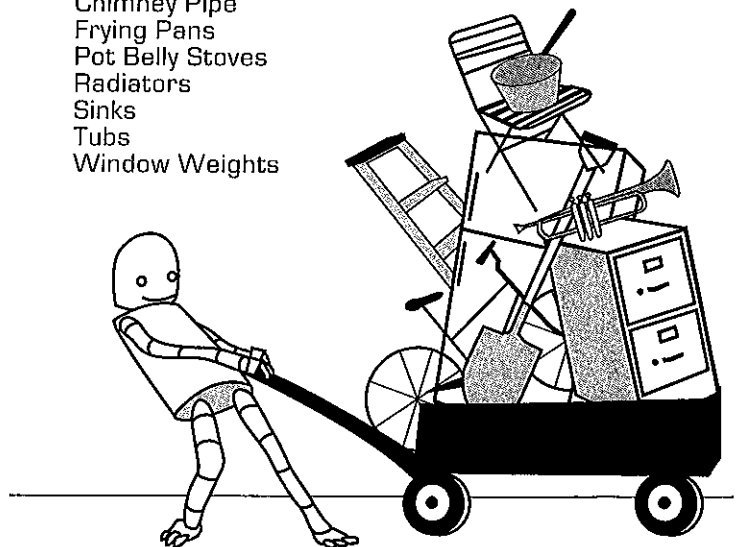

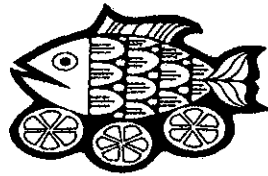

It's Friday night fish fry time

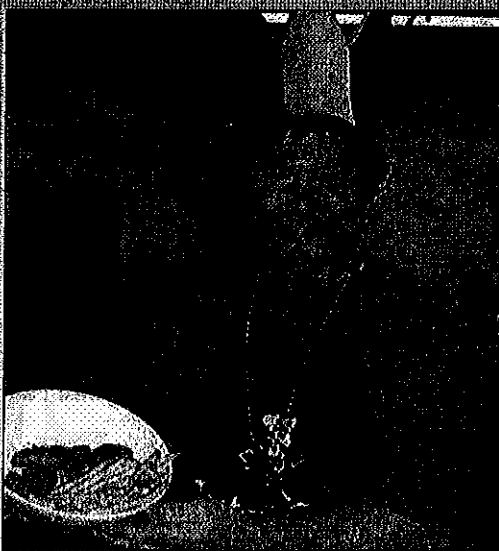
It's the Fish Fry Kids moving quickly about the tables in their bright yellow T-shirts and the friendly volunteers that make St. Sebastian Parish's fish fry feel more like a community social event than just a place to grab some dinner. For Kelyanna Austin, 30, there's more than delicious fish that makes it unique.

"I like that everybody works together, and there's a majority of men in the kitchen," she said, smiling from behind the counter where she was serving and refilling bowls of French fries for the Fish Fry Kids to take back to the dinner guests.

While St. Sebastian Parish celebrates 100 years, it's also celebrating its 50th year of fish fries that draw about 700 diners to each of its monthly fish fries served the first Friday of the month from October through May in the school cafeteria. During the six Fridays of Lent it is carry out only.

With about 90 volunteers — 60 adults and 30 grade school children — the parish serves all you can eat baked or fried fish, french fries, salad bar and cones of milk for adults for \$9.75, seniors for \$7.75 and between \$2.50 and \$5.50 depending on a child's age. Visitors can also purchase beer, desserts, a huge crowd of the soup of the month and family size carryout options include buckets of fish and fries, dinners, soups and extras.

"You see so many people from all the neighborhoods coming here," said Rany Walsh, former home and school chair. Fish fry goers may see local celebrity Mayor Tom Barrett, who worked the fish fry when he

attended the grade school in the '60s, and his wife, who volunteers, enjoys the home parish's fish fry.

"Dan Schley, parishoner and 10-year volunteer, said the fish fry is a glimpse of what the parish represents.

"It's such a vision of our community. I mean we have an amazing cross-section of people working here,"

said Schley, who noted that the baked fish recipe was tweaked since it was added by a man who used to run the fish fry a little more than a decade ago, who was active in disaster relief services throughout Milwaukee.

"It just really brings everything

together — everything that St. Sebastian is about shows at the fish fry. It's community, it's sharing meals, it's networking with each other and it also is a real outreach beyond the parish to the entire community," he said.

Rob Stephenson, 39, a parishoner with three children in the school, said the fish fry has become a fixture of the parish.

"We bill ourselves as the best fish fry in town" and, of course, we're biased," Stephenson laughed.

Helpful Hints for Parents during Lent

Fast and Abstinence (according to the Archdiocese of Milwaukee website)

- Customarily, fasting required that a person take only one meal a day, but current Church discipline permits one to take a main meal and two lesser meals which together do not equal the main meal.
- All persons who have reached their 14th birthday are bound by the law of abstinence. All adults are bound by the law of fast from their 18th to their 60th year.
- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat and meat products as well as days of fast.
- The other Fridays of Lent remain days of abstinence from meat and meat products.
- The Fridays of the year outside Lent remain days of penance, but the traditional abstinence from meat may be substituted with some other practice of voluntary self-denial or personal penance. This may be physical denial, self-restraint or acts of religion, charity or Christian witness.

More helpful hints for parents

The Catholic Church encourages abstaining from eating meat and poultry on all Fridays throughout the year, but in the United States that practice has become a Lenten obligation. Teenagers and adults are asked to not eat meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent, to honor Christ's sacrifices for us.

Fish and seafood are allowed, as well as dairy and other animal byproducts.

Although abstinence is not required of children, even very young kids should have no problem abstaining from eating meat one day a week during Lent. To prepare for the Lenten season, kids may enjoy brainstorming with their parents to think of meatless meals and snacks for the whole family. Cheese pizza, spaghetti, fish and chips, cheese quesadillas and other children's favorites can be Friday staples.

Some kids' favorite foods can be turned vegetarian by substituting beans, cheese, soy, tofu or mushrooms for meat. For instance, bean burritos, vegetarian chili and vegetable lasagna are great Friday night dinners for Lent.

Catholic fasting is not avoiding all food. On days of fasting, Catholics are asked to eat only what is necessary, usually one meal per day or two small meals, with no snacking, no sweets and no indulgences.

Children may not be able to skip meals, but can be encouraged to make other sacrifices on days of fasting. At the onset of Lent, children can help decide which snack foods they'll give up on fasting days. A short prayer before eating any food also helps children remember the purpose of the Lenten season.

With guidance from parents and teachers, Catholic children can get more out of the Lenten season and feel more a part of their church's most honored observances.

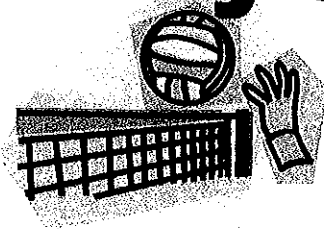
