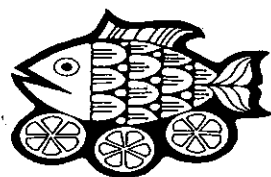


FISH FRY

Angel Icon

The Boutique Angel Icon was designed to represent the idea expressed in the movie "It's a Wonderful Life," the theme of this year's boutique. Every time a bell rings an angel gets its wings.

We want to remind everyone who hears our bells ring at St. Sebastian Church of this message. It speaks to our boutique theme, but also of the greater message regarding the angels among us - spiritual and human. We have all encountered people in our parish whose actions are above expectations - we could call them angelic. This symbol reminds us of those angels among us and how they generously contribute to our parish community and enrich each of our lives.

The actual design of the icon is a bell, representing our church bell. The "wings" are in the shape of an S, one on each side, to stand for St. Sebastian.

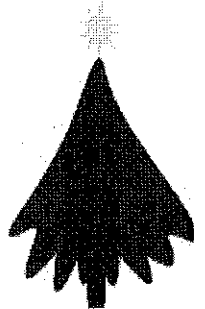

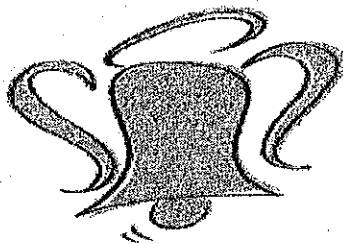
